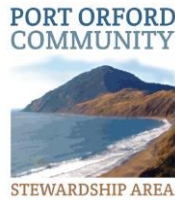

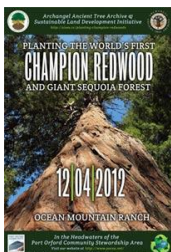
**Another Champion Redwood Clone Sapling to be Planted
In the Port Orford Community Stewardship Area**

(Port Orford, OR – July 9, 2013) Non-profit Archangel Ancient Tree Archive and Sustainable Land Development Initiative announced they will join local Port Orford Community Stewardship Area (POCSA) partners Ocean Mountain Ranch and the Rotary Club of Port Orford in planting a champion coast redwood clone sapling on a sheltered ½+ acre property which will be raffled to raise funds for the community service scholarship fund to promote social sustainability on the southern Oregon coast. The raffle will be conducted by the Port Orford Rotary pursuant to a license issued by the State of Oregon and in accordance with the laws and regulations of the State and Federal Government. This event follows a gifting of another clone from a champion redwood tree to the local Pacific High School where the tree was planted on Earth Day 2013, in concert with other champion tree plantings around the world - The Rotary Club of Port Orford lot raffle drawing will be held at 7 PM, October 26, 2013 at the Port Orford Community Building, 421 11th Street, Port Orford, Oregon.



In 2006, the local non-profit Port Orford Ocean Resource Team (POORT) began the steps to move the community in a direction that takes Ecosystem-Based Management into account by determining the boundaries of POCSA through identification of the ecosystem that the community is a part of and depends upon. First, POORT mapped and identified the historic fishing grounds and then included the terrestrial watershed of these fishing grounds. The result was a 1,320 square mile comprehensive and holistic depiction of the entire land-sea ecosystem surrounding Port Orford that sustains this unique community which is now being called a model for other rural communities around the world.

The goals of the tree planting and building lot raffle events are to increase participant knowledge, decrease duplicate efforts, and encourage partnerships within the stewardship area in order to share resources. These goals are important to the Port Orford community because of the well-established belief that our common good and well-being is directly connected to our natural resources. Careful management of these environmental resources provides [POCSA](#) with a foundation for a holistic triple-bottom-line approach to a people-planet-profit philosophy for community sustainability going forward.



Archangel Ancient Tree Archive partnered with Ocean Mountain Ranch on the [World's First Planting of a Champion Redwood & Sequoia Forest](#) in order to preserve the genetics of the largest and oldest living organisms on earth in an effort to assist with the migration of the species during coming climate changes. In addition to preserving champion tree genetics for future research, the plantings will provide a focal point for ongoing model terrestrial sustainability initiatives within the local community stewardship area and surrounding Curry County, Oregon -- a rare place on earth where beautiful wild and scenic rivers tumble down through steep canyons and the tallest and largest carbon-sequestering forests in the world on their way to the mighty Pacific Ocean.
